is one of the
oldest
musical
instruments
known
to man.

The Shofar is an ancient Hebrew musical instrument. It is made from the horn of a ram (called a Ram's Horn Shofar)



or from an African Kudu (called a Yemenite Shofar).



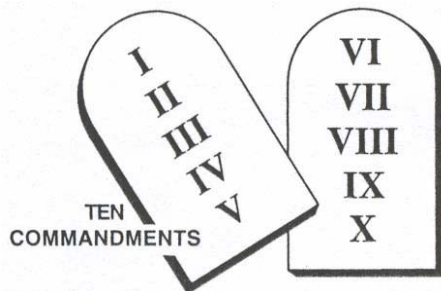
The word Shofar appears over seventy times in the Bible. When you see the word trumpet, trumpets, or coronet in the Bible, it usually means Shofar.

Many people have commented that something seems to happen when the Shofar is sounded, and that the sound it makes is totally awesome. In Revelations Chapter 1:10 and 4:1, the Holy Bible says the voice of God is like the sound of a trumpet. No wonder people think the Shofar sound is so awesome. It is like God's voice going forth into the atmosphere.

The first time we read about the Shofar being sounded is in Exodus Chapter 19 of

The Bible. God blew the Shofar as He gave mankind his law, "The Ten Commandments." Today, God is raising up people to sound the Shofar, to release His voice, to remind the world that His law, "The Ten Commandments," has not changed.

GOD'S LAW



Have you kept God's Law? Are you Sure?

- I. Worship no other gods.
- II. You shall make no idols.
- III. You shall not use the name of God irreverently, nor use it to swear.
- IV. Observe the Sabbath as a Holy Day—on that day, you are not to work.
- V. Honor your father and mother.
- VI. You must not murder.
- VII. You must not commit adultery.
- VIII. You must not steal.
- IX. You must not lie.
- X. You must not be envious.

Have you ever lied? Fibbed? Twisted a story to meet your needs? What's a person called that lies? A liar.

The Bible says: All liars will be thrown into the lake of fire, "Hell."

Have you ever stolen? A flashlight from work? Office supplies? A piece of candy when you were young? Have you ever taken anything that was not yours without permission? Have you ever cheated on your taxes? What is a person called that does these things? A thief.

Have you ever committed adultery? The Bible says if you even looked at a person with lust in your heart, you have committed adultery. Have you ever looked at a person with lust? What is a person called that has lusted? An adulterer.

The Bible says that liars, thieves, and adulterers will be thrown into the lake of fire. Forever separated from God.

Does that scare you? It should! Every person will either spend eternity in heaven or hell. Every person will stand before God and be judged. If you were judged by God at this exact moment, based only on the three commandments we just talked about, would you be found guilty or innocent of breaking God's Law? The sentence for being found guilty would be to spend forever in hell.

This sounds pretty hopeless, and it is. Unless you admit that you are a sinner, admit to being a law-breaker, and throw yourself on the mercy of the Judge (God).

John 1:14, "And the Word (Jesus) became flesh and dwelt among us, and
